

Run a Brainstorm

Generate ideas!

Great brainstorms are magical. They create a judgement free, optimistic experience that welcomes all voices and ideas.

Brainstorming rules:

- Defer judgment
- Build on the ideas of others
- Encourage wild ideas
- Stay focused on topic
- Be visual
- Go for quantity

Pro-tips:

- Say "Yes, and...". The first word accepts ideas and the second builds on it.
- Share ideas as "headlines"—don't go into too much detail.
- Stay focused in the how might we question at hand.

Run a brainstorm in 5 quick steps and 20 minutes or less:

- 1. Get materials together. Post-its often help to separate ideas, but they're not necessary.
- 2. Find some friends to brainstorm with!
- 3. Have the How might We question ready.
- 4. Share the Brainstorming Rules to set norms.
- Generate wild ideas!
